
Tell us about the project you're interested in!

- What's the name of your project?
- Where does it live, what's its URL?
- **When** did its last release take place?

Very good. Now let's talk a little more about your project.

- What's the software written in?
- Where other technologies does it use?
- **Does it** require some exotic hardware to run?
- **Has it** seen a stable production release yet?
- **Does it** have clear future plans, a.k.a. roadmap? If so, link to it!
- Can you make an estimate about the size of its user base?

And finally, we'll look into the sustainability of the project.



- **What's** the level of activity in the user community?
- **What's** the quality of the information for users & developers?
- **How** transparent are the project's processes?
- **Does** the project provide a variety of entry points?
- **Is** there sufficient room to make an impact?

Don't fret if you can't answer all of these questions right away! We'll be around and give **examples where to look** for the answers. Finally, we'll have a quick discussion on your results. Keep **your eyes open** for surprises.
